President's Corner

Upkeep of Property

From the Town of Clay: "It is hereby declared to be the policy of the town to provide for the proper use of land to prevent unhealthy, hazardous, or unsightly conditions due to the accumulation of brush, grass, rubbish, or weeds in order to protect the public health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of this town."

RUBBISH

- 1 - Lumber, junk, debris, building materials.
- 2 - Any abandoned, discarded or unused objects or equipment, such as, but not limited to, automobile parts, furniture, stoves, refrigerators, freezers appliances, can, containers or vehicle tires.
- 3 - Any compost pile that would spread or harbor disease, emit unpleasant odors, or attract rodents, vermin or other disease-carrying pests, animals or insects.
- 4 - Any unsanitary matter or materials.
- 5 - Solid waste and garbage.
- 6 - Tree trimmings, brush, or shrubbery trimmings, grass clippings, trees, brush or shrubbery or portions thereof severed from their roots or uprooted trees brush or shrubbery.

Paper Copies of Newsletter Are Available

School Affairs

The special education extended school year runs from July 6 to August 14 at Long Branch Elementary. Registration is due by May 15, 2020. All information and forms are on the district website.

There are still openings in the expanded pre-K program for 4 year olds, for the 2020 -2021 school year. Forms are online.

More information will be coming on school budget votes, and Board of Education elections. The district website still lists the school budget and Board of Education votes as being held on May 19. However, the governor has delayed the vote until at least June 1. More information on the actual date will be coming from the state.

If high school graduation cannot be held on June 20, the alternate date is July 25. However, it is important to check all dates with the district, as things are changing on a regular basis.

From the Bayberry Historian

Bayberry building is started with remote control ground-breaking ceremony May 23.

From THE REVIEW May 31, 1956

A detonator touched in the Albany office of Federal Housing Administration district director, Thomas Hannigan, May 23, set off an explosive charge on Bayberry Community, near Liverpool to officially start the building activity.

Located in the town of Clay, north of Liverpool, Bayberry will include churches, a school, shopping center, a cabana club and extensive park areas.

In setting off a dynamic charge by remote control, Mr. Hannigan praised the "massive private building program which will find 1,200 homes equipped with complete air conditioning".

"I think we are viewing a memorable moment here in Onondaga county," Supervisor Dyer said. "This unbroken ground over which we are standing will soon be a well-populated community ... one that will spring up almost overnight."

"Bayberry will soon be an important part of the county map and for that reason we are thankful for the advance planning which assures us not only of well-constructed homes for its members, but also provides the county with a place of beauty, an asset to our whole country-side."

Bayberry's model homes are expected to be open for inspection August 1.

(NOTE) At that time Bayberry Community was the largest development to have ever been started in Onondaga County.

Brush Collection

The Town of Clay Brush Collection began on March 17 and will continue every Tuesday until December 8. Brush includes leaves, grass clippings, shrub cuttings, small branches and twigs, and must be placed in rigid plastic or metal containers. Biodegradable lawn bags are acceptable, if kept dry and intact. Place all containers outside of road pavement and gutters so as not to obstruct traffic or block drainage.
