TOWN AFFAIRS

There are many exciting things going on in the Town of Clay which are getting statewide and national attention--the obvious example of putting this Town in the big leagues is the massive Amazon distribution center on Morgan Road, nearly 4 million square feet and creating 1,000 jobs starting in August with full operation in September.

Onondaga County has been purchasing property near and around the White Pine Commerce Park at the intersection Route 31 and Caughdenoy Road with hopes to attract a high-tech manufacturing firm, possibly chip production. There have been estimates of a potential of 3,000-4,000 new jobs. Contrary to some rumors, the County is paying well above market value, this information heard from speaking with one of the property owners and not "cheating" property owners of Clay. There will be additional meetings on the use of this site along with traffic impact studies for the Clay/Cicero Rt 31 Corridor.

The Byrne Dairy construction on Morgan Road is in full swing and the company is currently advertising for jobs and expects to open in late summer or early fall.

The storage facility on Rt 57 just south of Rt 31 has its storage units on site with installation coming soon.

This will be my last report as the BCA Town Affairs Chair and Newsletter Editor. After being a resident of the Town of Clay for nearly 55 years and Bayberry for 38 years, I will be passing the proverbial baton for both duties over to Jordan Curtis and heading east. Be active with the County and Town officials, believe it or not, when Bayberry as a group talks they listen! Continue to assist Jordan and the other BCA officers and volunteers with the great things that the association provides for its residents--best \$10 you could ever spend!
