The Hinerwadel's Zone Change continued Public Hearing will be held at the June 21st Town Board meeting at Town Hall on Route 31at 7:30 pm.

It's fire pit season again in the town of Clay and across Onondaga County. NYS Fire Code §Section 307 states that the minimum distance required from a structure is 25 feet and shall be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. Open burning that is offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions is prohibited--be a good neighbor!!

The Byrne Daily site on Morgan Road at Steelway Boulevard is under construction and appears to be quite large. Storage units on Route 57 are moving along as well.

Royal Car Wash is considering the site at 7376 Oswego Road currently Nick & Angelo's Restaurante as for a new location in CNY and is before the Planning Board seeking a special permit. Possible meeting date of July 14th at Town Hall.

Please remember that the speed limit is 30 mph which in many cases is still a bit fast for some side streets. Watch out for children on bikes and scooters. TAKE A FEW EXTRA SECONDS TO ACTUALLY STOP AT THE STOP SIGNS IN BAYBERRY.
