SCHOOL AFFAIRS

Tyler Drive - Tyler Drive is a mobile data GPS terminal that the Liverpool School district has installed on all school buses. It allows the district and parents to access data on when students board buses, when they exit the bus, the ETA for when a bus is scheduled to arrive at a stop, and more. Students will have a card to scan, when they enter/exit the bus. Parents can download the Traversa 360 app, which allows them to track bus arrival at stops. TOWN AFFAIRS

Town of Clay Fall Fun Fest scheduled for Saturday, October 8, 12-4pm. There will be food, vendors, music, etc. It will take place at Clay Park Central (4821 Wetzel Road).

Chick-fil-A seeking adjustments to zoning for property at Brewerton Road and East Taft Road. The adjustments are mostly to allow for more parking and the implementation of a drive-through lane.

Drainage/flooding (non-sewer) issues can be directed to the Highway Department.

The proposed Clay Marketplace, a mix of apartment complexes, retail, etc. at the corner of Route 31 and Henry Clay Boulevard has been progressing, most recently having a proposed zoning change from RC-1 to PDD.

VETERANS SPOTLIGHT

The U.S. flag stands for our nation and the shared history, pride, principles, and commitment of its people. When we properly display this powerful symbol, we signal our respect for everything it represents.

- The flag shouldn't be flown in inclement weather unless it's an all-weather flag.
- Flags displayed at night should be properly illuminated.
- In a time of national mourning, hang the flag at half-mast.

The flag can be flown every day, but it is often flown to show patriotism on these observances:

When displaying the flag:

- From your porch, place the union (blue section) at the peak of the staff.
- Against a wall or on a window, place the union (blue section) at the top left corner.
- On your vehicle, clamp the staff to the right front fender.
- With another flag, place the U.S. flag to your left when crossed.

Keep your flag completely dry and folded properly — into a triangle, with the union (blue section) visible — before storing it in a well-ventilated area. If the flag is damaged or worn out, it should be disposed of with dignity. The flag should not touch anything below it or rest on the ground.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING



- ⊗ **Do not bag recycling.** Place items in bin loose.
- ⊗ **No textiles/clothes,* footwear, etc.** — donate if wearable.
- ⊗ **No needles/syringes,* film plastics,* food waste* or toxic items.***
- ⊗ Avoid “wish-cycling” — **when in doubt, throw it out.**

- ✔ **Plastics:** Ignore the numbers; use shape to decide recyclability: bottle, jar, jug or dairy tub = recycle.
- ✔ **Paper:** Empty and flatten boxes. Remove packing or film plastics in or around boxes.
- ✔ **Containers:** Must be empty and rinsed. Labels are okay.
- ✔ **Lids and caps:** Reattach.

WHAT HAPPENS TO TRASH IN ONONDAGA COUNTY?



Trash is turned into electricity at the Waste-to-Energy Facility in Jamesville; it does not go to a landfill.

Each year this reduces greenhouse gas emissions equivalent to taking more than 60,000 vehicles off the road, makes enough energy to power 30,000 homes and recovers all metal in the trash, which is enough to build more than 10,000 cars!

RECYCLING RULES

DON'T BAG RECYCLABLES IN PAPER OR PLASTIC BAGS!



PLACE RECYCLING LOOSE IN BIN!

DON'T BAG RECYCLABLES



PAPER

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogs and softcover books *Keep loose, don't tie.*
- Papers and mail (including window envelopes)
- Boxes: Cardboard, takeout pizza, pasta, cereal, etc. *Empty and flatten.*
- Cartons: Milk, juice, soup, etc. (plastic spouts = OK) *Empty, rinse and reattach cap.*



PLASTIC (IGNORE NUMBERS; RECYCLE BY SHAPE)

- Bottles: Beverage, soap, shampoo, squeeze, spray, etc. (no bottles that held toxics) *Empty, rinse and reattach cap.*
- Jars: Mayonnaise, sauce, nuts, jelly, etc. *Empty, rinse and reattach cap.*
- Jugs (items with a handle): Milk, orange juice, water, detergent, windshield fluid, etc. *Empty, rinse and reattach cap.*
- Stackable tubs (dairy/dairy alternative only): Butter, yogurt, cottage cheese, etc. *Empty, rinse and reattach lid.*



METAL

- Food and beverage cans *Empty, rinse and place lid inside can.*
- Aluminum foil and disposable aluminum pans and plates *Must be clean and wadded up.*
- Aerosol cans *Must be empty. No cans that held toxics; they should go in the trash.*



GLASS

- Food containers: Salsa, jam, sauce, salad dressing, etc. *Empty, rinse and reattach lid.*
- Beverage containers (any color) *Empty, rinse and reattach cap.*
- Wine and liquor bottles *Option: They can also be brought to a participating redemption center to ensure they are turned into new bottles. Get details at OCRRRA.org.*



DROP OFF TO RECYCLE

- Shredded paper *Recycle for free at Bodow Recycling, 1925 Park St., Syracuse, bodowrecycling.com; or put in the trash.*

- Plastic bags (clean and dry) *Recycle at large grocery and retail stores.*
- Electronics *Visit ocrra.org/ewaste for details.*

- Propane tanks *Visit ocrra.org/propane-tanks for details.*
- Fire extinguishers *Visit ocrra.org/fire-extinguishers for details.*

- Light bulbs *Visit ocrra.org/fluorescent-bulbs for details. Place LED and incandescent bulbs in the trash.*



TRASH

- Frozen food boxes
- Soda/beer boxes
- Egg cartons (any type)
- Items with glitter or foil
- Takeout or fast food boxes
- Plates and cups
- Tissue paper
- Hardcover books

- Tanglers (cords, hoses, etc.)
- “Clamshells” (berry, salad, bakery cartons)
- Takeout or fast food boxes
- Disposable cups, lids and utensils
- Prescription vials
- Tires
- Containers that held toxics

- Any metals not listed above
- Small appliances (toasters, vacuums, etc.)
- Combination metal-cardboard canisters (oatmeal, cocoa, peanuts, coffee, etc.)
- Empty metal paint cans

- Broken glass
- Drinking glasses
- Ovenware, ceramics and dishes
- Window and picture glass
- Mirrors
