2024 OFFICER ELECTIONS

February

An Election Committee will be appointed by the President to oversee the election process. A call for nominees shall be published via Association Media including the February Newsletter.

March

Nominees shall be called for at the March Board of Directors meeting and a second call for nominees shall be published via Association Media including the March newsletter.

April

Nominees for all officer positions will be announced by the Election Committee and any additional nominations accepted from the floor at the April Board of Directors Meeting. Nominees will be given the opportunity to introduce themselves and should be given the opportunity to submit a short introduction for publication in Association Media. Two ballots listing the finalized slate of officer candidates shall be published in the April Newsletter. Members shall be advised of their option to mail in their sealed ballot to the Association P.O. Box or submit it at the May meeting via a designee rather than attending in person. The list of candidates shall also be publicized via Association media.

May

Balloting: All ballots must be submitted prior to the close of voting at the May meeting. Blank ballots shall be available at the meeting. The president shall announce the close of voting whereupon no further ballots will be accepted. All ballots will now be tallied by the members of the Election Committee. The Secretary shall announce the results of the balloting once the tally is complete. The newly elected Officers shall assume their duties on July 1st.

NYS Resilient Retrofits

Apply for a 1% Loan and get a Matching Grant

New York State homeowners may be eligible for up to \$50,000 in a 50/50 loan/grant* program to undertake flood mitigation measures and other climate-ready improvements to their homes, including energy upgrades.

*Matching grants are considered deferred loans through the term of the loan and are forgiven once the terms of the loan are satisfied









Program Details And Eligibility

- Up to \$50,000 in a combination low-interest loan with matching grant for flood mitigation and energy efficiency and electrification improvements (main structure of the home only)
- Loans are at a 1% simple interest rate and are payable over 5-10 years
- Grant portion, of up to \$25,000, is considered a deferred loan through the term of the loan and forgiven once the terms of the loan are satisfied
- Homes located in Extreme Risk Areas, Floodways and Coastal Erosion Zones are not eligible to participate
- Homeowners choose their own properly insured and certified contractor(s)
- Household income must be at or below 120% of HUD median income
- No minimum credit score required
- Primary residences only
- Owner-occupied, 1-4 unit buildings allowed
- · Homeowner must undertake a flood mitigation measure as part of the overall home improvement.
