

TOWN OF CLAY LEGAL NOTICES

Residents are reminded to keep any brush/lawn debris out of roadways. Please see the website for more information. Residents are advised to be patient and leave brush by the road; it will be picked up as quickly as possible.

ROAD SAFETY

Colder weather has arrived! Please keep roads clear of brush and leaf piles from properties (it is illegal to place brush or piles in the road). The sun sets earlier in the fall and winter. Be aware of pedestrians; if you are walking, it is best to wear light-color clothing along with reflective elements.

SCHOOL AFFAIRS

Capital project - basement work, including new piping, has been done at the Wetzel Road site. Also at Wetzel, removal of plumbing fixtures in one wing and ceiling and hallway work in another wing of the building has been done. Work on the stadium bleachers will begin on November 11.

There will be an emergency early dismissal drill on November 26. The times for each building to be dismissed are online on the district website.
